- 2. Encouraging students to evaluate subject related articles which appear in newspapers and journals.
- 3. Promote student participation in seminars and power point presentation by students
- 4. Giving individual attention to students during practical classes.
- 5. IQAC Co-ordinator keeps in touch with all the departments and tracks the activities of all faculty and students of departments concerned.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Periodical examination and tests are conducted to assess the progress of students. The University conducts 2 semester exams every year. The institution conducts 2 test papers and 1 model examination before the commencement of university examinations. Student's improvement is also kept track of with the help of assignment, seminars and GDs.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The College encourages the teaching faculty to pursue research work. Student's research is made mandatory for all Subjects. Whenever Seminars and Conferences are conducted students are also encouraged as far as possible to present papers. Similarly seminars conducted as part of club activities also give opportunities for students for paper presentations

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Smart class, ICT facilities are made available for the students of almost all departments.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The College initiates several approaches for Human Resource management and for enhancing efficiency. The roles played by NSS, NCC and the club activities are very significant. The fixed time for lunch break and mind- body refreshing is ensured for the office staff for improving efficiency of office staff. Proximity to a well-functioning canteen, consistent fresh drinking water availability and solar panel generated partial power supply and library reading facilities are also intended for effective Human Resource Management. The students are also provided PSC Coaching and interview training facilities. The Office staffs are encouraged to take MOP, and at times computer training is also provided for Office staff. The teachers are encouraged to participate in refresher and Orientation Classes for self-improvement.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The teaching faculty is recruited on the basis of qualifications such as NET, PhD. The office staff recruitment is carried out as per government regulations, on the basis of qualification and merit.
